

## **ATTENDANCE**

Thank you for everything you are doing to get children. "In school, on time, every day and learning ready"

Our whole school attendance this week is 94.1%. Thank you for your support in helping us reach our target of 96%

Well done to Porth for achieving our highest attendance at 97.6% this week!

Please continue to fill out an Absence request form (available from the office or on our website) if you wish to take your child on holiday.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.






# Reading at SNELA

# Here's what we have been learning...



#### <u>Holywell</u>

In Literacy, Foundation children have been reading Bringing the Rain to Kapiti Plain' and practicing their picture caption writing skills. For Topic they have been busy making mud huts and matching different types of homes to different parts of the world. They were also very excited to see how much our vegetable seeds have grown since planting them a couple of weeks ago! Year I had a lovely walk into St Newlyn East village to do a traffic survey on different types of transport that travel through the village. Identify different road signs and they also thoroughly enjoyed visiting the Preaching Pit - where all were keen to 'perform a song and dance' to the rest of the group!





#### Tolcarne

Over the last couple of weeks in PE, Tolcarne have been learning how to roll, strike and catch a ball using a range of skills. In Science, we investigated our outdoor garden for micro-habitats and recorded the variety of animals we found. In Geography, we have been using our atlas books and mini globes to find out why the weather isn't the same everywhere in the world. They have also been creating nets and 3D models in computing and then creating these after they've been printed.
