97.2% We have exceeded our target of 96% Well done to Reception and Year 4 for achieving our highest attendance at 100% this

week! Pease continue to fill out an Absence request form (available from the office or on our website) if you wish for your child to take an absence.

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

Holywell

We've been so busy in Holywell class over the last couple of weeks and have especially been enjoying learning about how and why different modes of transport have changed from the past. After learning about the history of flight, Year 1 had a go at making and testing our own paper aeroplanes that needed to be aerodynamic in design like modern planes! Watergate

Year 5 have been working incredibly hard in all their subjects, they've been writing their own version of *Percy Jackson the Lightning Thief*. In Maths, they've been working hard on adding and subtracting and have taken home some very difficult Maths problems. In the afternoons, we have been learning about the Trojan Horse story and whether it is a myth or not. Alongside that, we have been focusing on Science and how different objects have different properties.



Crantock

As we approach the end of the first half term in Year 6, the children have really engaged with and enjoyed their learning. In Literacy, they have invented their own *Grimm* tales and are now deep into our class guided reading book. In Maths, we have finished our unit on place value and are now moving into the 4 main operations. Our afternoon learning in Geography has been centred around volcanoes, and particularly volcanoes on a remote island in Iceland. Here the children are

writing diary entries as a child who is experiencing an eruption and needing to be evacuated.
