If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of

Here's what we have been learning...

Holywell

It's been a busy couple of weeks in Holywell class as we begin our new topics. In Science we've been learning about parts of the human body and their functions. We've also been thinking about

the early lead up to Christmas for Christians in RE- on that note... Nativity preparations have begun with some glorious singing! The Year Is have been enjoying our new Literacy text *Little Bear's* Trousers and have been retelling the story in their own words. Foundation continue to make great progress with their sounds and letter formation- we're so impressed.



Tolcarne

Year 2 are loving being historians this term. We have learned all about Guy Fawkes and why we celebrate Bonfire Night. We have been discussing Remembrance Sunday and have made poppies for our school display. In Maths, we are adding and subtracting, using fact families and related facts to help us. In Science, we have begun learning about the different types of materials around us.



Porth



In year 3 this week we have been working hard, learning about the human body and our skeletal system. We have been finding out about the different bones in the human body which make up our skeleton and also the function of each bone. The children worked in small groups to construct their own skeleton

diagram, which they then checked, to make sure the bones were in the correct place. Through lots of discussion and demonstrations we all managed to construct our skeletons correctly. In our Literacy we have been writing about emotions from our text The Heart and the Bottle and writing some super sentences.

Fistral

Great fun has been had by Year 4 in Literacy. The classroom was overtaken by pesky Varrmints who caused mayhem. Along with a mysterious gardener, who left some scattered seeds, our topic has been shrouded in mystery... more next time! During Maths we have been exploring multiplying by 10 and 100, we have mastered

subtracting four-digit numbers and estimating. Phew a busy start to the term! In Music we have enjoyed learning to play the glockenspiel, pitch, and tempo! We are currently completing a topic about Anglo Saxons for History and are fascinated by our *Viking Boy* book in guided reading.



Watergate

After a relaxing and well earned half term, the Year 6 children

have been excellent learners. In Literacy we are continuing the daily reading of our class novel and the children have just finished writing balanced debates about which natural disaster they believe to be most destructive. In Maths, we are well into our unit on the 4 main operations with a focus on the different strategies that the children can choose from to divide. In Science they children enjoyed learning about classification and have created their own creatures for their peers to classify using a key. Here the children were discussing the idea of 'ls God Real?' related to Christianity.
